For the Family:

Matilda by Roald Dahl, read by Kate Winslet—story of an extraordinary little girl who takes on the evil Miss Trunchbill. *Echo* by Pam Munoz Ryan—Lost in the Black Forest, Otto meets three mysterious sisters and finds himself entwined in a prophecy, a promise, and a harmonica--and decades later three children, Friedrich in Germany, Mike in Pennsylvania, and Ivy in California find themselves caught up in the same thread of destiny in the darkest days of the twentieth century, struggling to keep their families intact, and tied together by the music of the same harmonica.

Fiction:

The Handmaid's Tale by Margaret Atwood, read by Claire Danes—Fertility rates in women are at a staggering low in this patriarchal American society of the slight future, which results in slave trade. Women with the ability to conceive are kidnapped, bought and owned by wealthy families to keep their lineage alive. The author does such a great job in creating this world, that this concept isn't so far fetched.

Ready Player One by Ernest Cline, read by Wil Wheaton—takes place in the not-so-distant future—the world has turned into a very bleak place, but luckily there is OASIS, a virtual reality world that is a vast online utopia. People can plug into OASIS to play, go to school, earn money, and even meet other people (or at least they can meet their avatars), and for protagonist Wade Watts it certainly beats passing the time in his grim, poverty-stricken real life.

Memoir & Biography:

As You Wish: Inconceivable Tales from the Making of the Princess Bride by Cary Elwes—Read by the actor and features cameos from Billy Crystal, Robin Wright and many more. Their stories are full of infectious warmth which makes it good for a family ride. Born a Crime: Stories from a South African Childhood by Trevor Noah—Read by the author he tells of his wild coming-of-age story during the twilight of apartheid in South Africa and the tumultuous days of freedom that followed.

Non-fiction:

What if? Serious Scientific answers to absurd hypothetical questions by Randall Munroe, read by Wil Wheaton— Short chapters that answer random scientific questions such as "How fast can you hit a speed bump while driving and live?". This is a great audiobook for the science geeks in your life.

John F. Kennedy and Abraham Lincoln held two presidencies, both one hundred years apart. Though different moments in time, both men's lives which included their wives, their children, and the times they lived in, ran directly parallel in time to each other.

Historian, Jim Gibbons, will present the similarities between our 35th and 16th Presidents of the United States from the number of children each had, to the letters in their last names, and to the places where they were to die. Gibbons will present to you many of the similarities that repeatedly and eerily mapped these presidents' paths which headed both men straight towards their tragic rendezvous with destiny!

June Book Club Selection: Across Five Aprils by Irene Hunt

Published in 1964 and the winner of the 1965 Newbery Honor.. Across Five Aprils is the story of the Creightons, a farm family from southern Illinois that struggles to survive the upheaval of the Civil War years. Jethro Creighton, the main character, is nine years old when the story begins, and his sister Jenny is fourteen. The story takes place over the five Aprils of the Civil War: April 1861 through April 1865. The tale is focused, in particular, on Jethro's coming of age—and, to a lesser extent, his sister Jenny's journey into young adulthood. This book is considered to be one of the first Young Adult books published.
