Community Conversations is a new program at Cordova Library. We will gather each month to talk about the history of the area. Our community has a rich history for a small community. The Library wants to document this history before it is lost. **The first Conversation will be Wednesday, January 16th at 1pm.**

Topics we will be discussing over the next few months will include:

- Schools—what was Cordova School like? Also, what was it like when Cordova School and Port Byron School merged?
- Cordova History—People of Cordova, Places in Cordova, Stories of Cordova
- River History—what was it like before the dams went in? Fishing stories from the river.

For the Community Conversations, we will have a roundtable discussion. The facilitators will have prompts to start the discussions. The Library will also be recording these conversations to document the history. These stories will also be used in future Library newsletter articles. Also, if anyone has pictures to go along with the stories, please bring them along!

Veterans History Project

The Veterans History Project (VHP) is a part of the Library of Congress American Folk life Center. The Project collects and preserves the firsthand interviews and narratives of United States military veterans from World War I through the present. Veterans are anyone who served in the U.S. Military who was discharged or released under conditions other than dishonorable.

Cordova District Library would like to contribute to the project by collecting veteran's stories and submit them to the VHP. If you are interested in contributing to the project—call the Cordova Library to sign up for an interview time. The interview will be recorded either with video or audio for at least 30 minutes. The Cordova Library will submit the finished interview to the Veterans History Project.

DID YOU KNOW?

Just two weeks after the first railroad bridge across the Mississippi River opened, the steamboat Effie Afton collided with the bridge causing both to burn. Although the bridge was rebuilt and opened in September 1856, court cases involving the railroad's right to span the river followed for several years thereafter. In the first court case in 1857, then-attorney **Abraham Lincoln** defended the railroad against steamboat interests at the U. S. Circuit Court in Chicago. Because the jury failed to reach a verdict and was discharged, the bridge remained. The case was taken all the way to the U. S. Supreme Court, which ruled in January 1863 that the bridge could remain.

Dye Fabric with Cheryl & Sue at Cordova Library Friday, January 11, 2019

Our traditional A, B, C / Dye 30 colors is 10:00 -12:00. Participants will pick a color group and go home with a rainbow of fabrics. Check out our website to see the color palettes. A supply list is available online or in the library when you sign up for the workshop. Bring your own lunch to eat in between sessions.

You may want to try your hand at something new. Shibori techniques, fold and dip dye, or continue to mix and dye unusual fabrics. Bring plenty of fabric (great way to use up scraps). Other fabrics to try include burlap, lace, doilies, ugly fabric to over dye, etc. This is your chance to be creative! We will continue into the afternoon with "play time" until 4:00.

CORDOVA TOWNSHIP PARK DISTRICT

The Board Members of the Cordova Township Park District wishes everyone a very Happy New Year! The Cordova Township Park District was established by referendum approved by voters in 2011. The Park District includes Cordova Township households and businesses that are in the Erie School District.

The Park District Board is a 5-person board, with members serving 6-year terms. In April the Board will have a vacancy, as one of the members is not seeking re-election. At that time the Board would appoint a board member to serve until the next general election (April 2021). Anyone wishing to be considered for the vacancy must be a resident of the Park District for at least one year. Park District elections are non-partisan. but the candidate for office must be a registered voter within the Park District.
