### Ten Reasons to Try an E-audiobook

An e-audiobook is an audiobook you can download to your phone or tablet. Here are ten reasons you should give one a try:

- 1. You can "read" while getting other stuff done. I have listened to e-audiobooks while weeding, folding laundry, painting, jogging, flying on a plane and driving a car. If my mind wanders, I can tap the back button which rewinds the story 15-30 seconds at a time. Plus, it makes doing the dishes a lot less boring.
- 2. **E-audiobooks are portable.** You can listen to one almost anywhere. You don't need a cd player or a giant backpack just a mobile device. Tablets and phones are lighter than most books and they fit in your pocket. Plus, you can download multiple books at a time. Imagine the suitcase space you can save.
- 3. **E-audiobooks are user-friendly.** For instance, e-audios automatically bookmark your place. It will remember where you left off after your jog and pick it right back up when you get in the car to run errands. It even remembers your place when you switch devices! Also, if you want to read faster, you can speed up the narration. There's more you can set a sleep timer and have someone read you to sleep.
- 4. There is never a late fee. Never. E-audiobooks have due dates just like traditional library materials. However, when your e-audiobook is due, it simply disappears from your device. You don't have to do anything. If you weren't done, you can check it out again and it will remember where you left off.
- 5. **E-audiobooks can be paired with traditional print books to allow you to read even more!** One of my favorite things to do is get one book in two formats: print and e-audio. I read the print book in bed at night and listen to the audio version while doing other activities. This method allows me to read *a lot* more books.
- **6. The Narrators!** Truly talented narrators enrich your experience of enjoying a book. They breathe life into the characters by giving them a voice. When you listen to an e-audio, you aren't listening to someone read a book you're listening to someone *perform* a book.
- 7. **E-audiobooks can open up a world of stories to people with a number of challenges.** Dyslexia, visual impairments, muscle degeneration in the hands and other challenges can have a huge impact on whether you can read a physical book or not. E-audiobooks can help you keep in touch with your love of storytelling.
- 8. **E-audiobooks improve critical listening skills.** Listening to audiobooks forces you to focus on the sounds of words. In doing so, this builds your capacity to focus, and develops your critical listening skills.
- 9. **E-audiobooks allow you to enjoy a book with others.** On road trips we often find our travel mates on separate devices listening to separate things. E-audiobooks encourage a truly shared experience. There are many titles you can enjoy with a mixed group of ages and interests.
- **10. It's hip.** E-audiobooks are the fastest growing book format in the publishing industry. The rise of smart phones and devices increased e-audio accessibility. According to the Audio Publishers Association, 47% of frequent listeners are under the age of 35.

E-Audiobooks are available through the Cordova Library's E-resources Hoopla and E-Read Illinois. Stop in the Library for help setting up the e-resources on your device.

#### August 6th—A Lady's Guide to Etiquette and Murder by Dianne Freeman

Frances Wynn, the American-born Countess of Harleigh, enjoys more freedom as a widow than she did as a wife. After an obligatory year spent mourning her philandering husband, Reggie, she puts aside her drab black gowns, leaving the countryside and her money-grubbing in-laws behind. With her young daughter in tow, Frances rents a home in Belgravia and prepares to welcome her sister, Lily, arriving from New York—for her first London season.

While busy with social engagements on Lily's behalf, and worrying if Reggie really was murdered, Frances learns of mysterious burglaries plaguing London's elite. The investigation brings death to her doorstep, and Frances rallies her wits, a circle of gossips, and the ever-chivalrous Mr. Hazelton to uncover the truth. A killer is in their midst, perhaps even among her sister's suitors. And Frances must unmask the villain before Lily's season—and their lives—come to a most unseemly end . . .

#### September 3rd—Lilli De Jong by Janet Benton

Philadelphia, 1883. Twenty-three-year-old Lilli de Jong is pregnant and alone—abandoned by her lover and banished from her Quaker home. She gives birth at a charity for wronged women, planning to give up the baby. But the power of their bond sets her on a completely unexpected path. Unwed mothers in 1883 face staggering prejudice, yet Lilli refuses to give up her baby girl. Instead, she braves moral condemnation and financial ruin in a quest to keep the two of them alive.

Lilli confides this story to her diary as it unfolds, taking readers from a charity for unwed mothers to a wealthy family's home and onto the streets of a burgeoning American city. Her story offers a rare and harrowing view into a time when a mother's milk is crucial for infant survival.
