Change at First Baptist . . .

Dear Community Members, As you are probably aware, Pastor John Kress has answered the call of a church in Kansas, nearly Nebraska. It might seem strange to people who are not acquainted with the Baptist philosophy or those from a faith background where pastors,

priests, and other ordained leaders are just simply assigned to a new church or area in a routine fashion. Baptists have the mindset that congregations are independent bodies and will search for a pastor much like a school system looking for a new superintendent. A vacancy is posted,

applications are reviewed, and eventually a selection is made. However, the process is never as streamlined and quick as the above description. It all takes time, even in this electronic age. The process can take up to three years, with the average time being seventeen months. We hope for less, but pray for a good fit and long-term pastorate.

We think of our church as a community church serving everyone in many capacities. In that regard, weddings and funerals will still be held, food baskets will be distributed; Monday dinners in East Moline will still be shared. We may cut back to the basics for a while, but the organization will still strive to be the hands and feet of Christ in the community. This can be a time when members look more deeply into themselves to find their gifts and talents that lie dormant when someone such as a pastor seems able to bridge the gap. It is a time of both growth and challenge for us all.

Reverend Bruce McNeely will be an interim pastor starting January 5th. He will be with us for a while until we find someone willing to stay with us through the process. If there are concerns, the 654-2501 phone number still works and someone is checking the answering machine.

In the meantime, we ask that you pray for wisdom and patience for the search committee from the church as well as for the person who will receive the call. May they be receptive and open to all Cordova has to offer.

Microsoft will no longer support Windows 7 as of January 14, 2020. This means Windows 7 users who don't upgrade to Windows 10 will no longer be able to get Microsoft's security updates or fixes, or technical support for any issues -- leaving your computer at greater risk from viruses and malware.

Here's how to get Windows 10, if you're currently running a licensed, activated copy of Windows 7, Windows 8 or Windows 8.1:

- **1.** Go to the *Download Windows* 10 website at https://www.microsoft.com/en-us/software-download/windows10.
- 2. Under Create Windows 10 installation media, click Download tool now and Run.
- 3. Choose Upgrade this PC now.
- 4. Follow the prompts.
- **5.** When the upgrade is complete, go to **Settings Update & Security > Activation**, and you should see a digital license for Windows 10.

2020 New Year - New Laws

255 new laws took effect on January 1, 2020. Here are a few highlights.

Minimum Wage—Those earning minimum wage will get a raise on Jan. 1 when Illinois increases the state's minimum wage for the first time in over a decade, from \$8.25 to \$9.25 per hour. The minimum wage will increase to \$15 per hour by Jan. 1, 2025.

Servers—Servers may now keep all the <u>tips and gratuities</u> they earn for great service, and employers are required to keep their hands off of it under a new law that takes effect Jan. 1.

Education—High school seniors in the top 10 percent of their class by GPA are <u>guaranteed acceptance</u> to NIU, SIU, WIU and EIU, provided they meet other criteria for admissions.

Illinois Vehicle Code--School Buses--Raises the mandatory fines for illegally passing a school bus from \$150 to \$300 for an initial violation and \$500 to \$1,000 for a future violation.

ATVs—Provides that a person may operate an all-terrain vehicle or recreational off-highway vehicle on a roadway with a speed limit of 55 MPH or less (rather than 35 miles per hour or less).

+—Clarifies that vehicles need to slow down, change lanes and proceed with caution when approaching disabled vehicles or emergency vehicles on the side of the highway. Increases fines and penalties associated with breaking Scott's Law

Cat Vaccinations—Requires cats to receive a rabies vaccination with a tag and certification. The requirement does not apply to feral cats unless the feral cat is taken to the vet for sterilization

DNA Privacy—Companies such as Ancestry.com and 23 and Me are prohibited from sharing consumers' genetic testing results and other personal identifiable information with any health or life insurance company without the consumer's written consent.

Cannabis—Adults 21 and over may legally purchase recreational marijuana from a state-regulated recreational dispensary.

Bathrooms—Single-occupancy restrooms in public locations are required to be identified as all-gender and designated for use by no more than one person at a time or for family or assisted use. Signs posted outside the restroom must not indicate any specific gender. After Jan. 1, all public restrooms in public buildings must be equipped with a baby-changing station.
