









Re-Opening Plan

Governor Pritzker released a five-stage reopening plan for the state on May 5. The stages are *Phase 1: Rapid Spread*, *Phase 2: Flattening*, *Phase 3: Recovery*, *Phase 4: Revitalization* and *Phase 5: Illinois Restored*. The plan divides the state into four regions that can move through the stages independently of one another. We are located in the North-central Region and are in Phase 3: *Recovery*.

The Recovery Phase 3 allows for gatherings of 10 or fewer people and non-essential businesses continuing home delivery and curbside pickup as well as opening with safety precautions including capacity limits, social distancing and face covering requirements.

Here is what the Recovery phase means for Cordova District Library Services:

Access to Materials:

Home Delivery: E-mail (hello@cordovalibrary.com) or call (309-654-2330) the library to request materials and make arrangements for a delivery time.

Curbside Pickup: E-mail (hello@cordovalibrary.com) or call (309-654-2330) the library to request materials and make arrangements for a pickup time.

In Person Browsing & Checkout: People may come to the library to select materials in person by appointment from 9am-11am Monday-Friday and 5pm-7pm Monday-Thursday. People coming into the library must follow the following safety protocol: 1) Do not enter the library if you are exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms; 2) wash hands with soap and water for a minimum of twenty seconds before entering the main area of the library; 3) face masks are required for all people over the age of two who do not have a medical condition or disability that prevents them from safely wearing a face-covering; and 4) make every effort to maintain a safe social distance of six feet or more.

Online Resources: Available 24/7. All you need is your library card number and pin (the last four digits of your library card number). Contact the library if you don't know your card number.

Return of Materials:

The book drop is open 24/7. We will NOT accept items during home delivery in order to avoid the possibility of cross-contamination. All returned items are put into quarantine for the duration recommended by our library system – currently seven days.

Census 2020

The 2020 Census count has begun! If you haven't completed your survey yet, go to www.my2020census.gov to begin. It takes less than 10 minutes to complete. Why is it necessary to complete the Census? Governments make decisions on how to allocate funds based on the census count.

The Census also captures history of the time. Census records are released 72 years after the Census count. Therefore, the 1950 Census will be released on April 1, 2022. It is fun to go back in history and see where your ancestors lived, their occupations, property owned and other ancestors living with them or close by. We have Hot Spots!

Our Hot Spot program started right before our library had to close for quarantine. Fortunately, we were able to deploy some Hot Spots into the community before we closed down. Here are some of the ways the Hot Spots were used:

- * A teacher was able to upload materials to her students online.
- * Two students were able to complete their assignments virtually.
- Two adults were able to work remotely from home.

Hotspots are portable WiFi that allow you to connect up to ten devices and are available for checkout from the library. They use the Sprint network, so the Hot Spots might not work in some areas.



Adult Cordova Library Cardholders in good standing (no fines or missing items) are eligible to borrow the hotspots.

Summer Learning Challenge 2020

Reading+Challenges+Art Camp in a Box+Pop-Up Challenges=POINTS!!

Our Summer Reading Program is now the Cordova Library Summer Learning Challenge!! Why is it changing? We believe that everyone can learn in different ways. Sometimes, it is through reading. Other times, it can be through an art camp. Or, learning can happen during a visit from therapy dogs.

This year, our Summer Learning Challenge will be based on a points system. The goal of the program is to reach 1,000 points. **Challenge participants must read at least 300 minutes**. All reading materials must be checked out at Cordova District Library. Cordova Residents may use E-Resources for their reading material. There are many ways to reach 1,000 points.

- 1 minute reading = 1 point
- Story Time for ages 0-5 = 50 points per Story Time
- Participate in 1 weekly Challenge and report = 50 points per challenge (10 challenges maximum)
- Art & Science Camps in a Box = 250 points per camp
- Sewing Camp = 100 points
- Pop-Up Challenges = 50 points
- Tales on the Trail = 50 points

Use the calendars provided after you sign up to keep track of your points. Mark off which weekly challenges you have completed and send us a picture through Facebook, Instagram or email at hello@cordovalibrary.com.

Participants that check-in weekly will receive 1 ticket per week for the Drawings. Check in and show us how many points you've earned the week of June 29th and you will receive a \$5 gift card of your choice. When completing the program (1,000 points), you will receive a \$15 gift card of your choice and two tickets for our Grand Prize Drawings! News from the church

First Baptist Church of Cordova has worked to be a helpful presence in this time of pandemic. Our major form of outreach has been through FaceBook. The Sunday service of Music and Message is streamed live at 9:30 on Sunday and on demand throughout the week. Rev. McNeely is sharing a message filled with hope and Elaine Seevers is sharing her musical talents on the organ. Since we average 140 views each week, we intend to continue this practice at least through the summer.

Sunday, June 14th has been set as a time to open the church for a limited (35 - 40 minute) service. Anyone attending will be expected to observe the social distancing guidelines of distance, using had sanitizer, and refraining from handshakes, hugs, etc. as much as we are missing one another. Bibles and hymnals will be removed from the pew racks. Each person will select a sanitized hymnal from designated areas and leave it on the pew when they exit. Offerings may be placed in plates located by the entrances to the sanctuary.

All materials used in the service will have been disinfected including the pews, hymnals, door handles, and handrails. No items such as collection plates or bulletins will be passed from hand to

hand. Alternate pews will be designated as closed or open to help people make good choices for seating. As stated above, the live streaming service will still be available for those who prefer.

The quarterly business meeting/ Advisory board will be held on July 1st at 7 PM in Prescott Hall to accommodate social

distancing.

Lastly, our email account was hacked earlier in the year, and we lost our contacts. No message is generally needed. Rev. McNeely will continue with us until the pandemic eases.

We are thankful for no instances of serious illness and only a limited number of deaths due to natural causes. We extend our sympathy to the families of Richard Waldorf and Priscilla Cord who were both long-time members of our community.
