2024: A New Year Means New Improvements

We have a lot of irons in the fire and we are excited about all of them. Here is a glimpse of some of the improvements you will see in 2024:

Website: Our website is getting a complete makeover this Spring. The new site will look better and function better. We currently post lots of information on Facebook and Instagram. Our goal is to reach more people, regardless of social media usage, with our updated site.

Shelving: We are replacing the free-standing shelves (not the ones on the perimeter of the library) with new, mobile units. The new shelves will be on casters which will improve the flexibility of our space. For example, with mobile shelving we can rearrange the shelves when we host large programs in the main room of the library. We expect the new shelves to arrive sometime in March. We do not know what we are doing with the old shelves yet.

Teen Space: You may have heard we received a grant from River Cities Rotary to create a Teen Space in the library. We are thrilled! The Teen Advisory Board is actively involved in helping plan this project. This area will include the Teen Cares Closet, comfortable seating, art and craft supplies, games and even a small refrigerator. We hope to have the Teen Space completed by the end of the school year.

Parking Lot: Our parking lot is getting re-designed and replaced. We need to address some drainage issues and hope to improve our parking options. We are working with an engineer and the Village of Cordova to see if there is any way to safely create more parking spots. We expect to advertise for sealed bids in February and complete the work this Summer.

Retaining Wall: Our retaining wall is bowing from the effects of 27 years of weight and gravity. We are tackling this project at the same time as we tackle the parking lot.
