



## Cordova Library Turns 150!

In 2026, Cordova Library proudly celebrates 150 years of serving our community—and we're planning a year full of fun, history, and connection!

Here's a sneak peek at what's coming:

Our anniversary celebration officially kicked off at our open house with the release of a Cordova History Calendar, featuring historical photos of Cordova for each month. Due to its popularity, additional calendars can be ordered through January 15 for \$11. Calendars will be delivered by the end of January. To order, stop by the library with cash or check.

Looking ahead to February, we'll also have a limited-edition 150th anniversary tote bag available as a giveaway. These will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis, so stop in early, say hello, and grab one while supplies last!

We're excited to celebrate this milestone with you all year long—thank you for being part of Cordova Library's story!

### Cordova Library History

The first library group started as a reading room in 1876. The first meeting was held in the Cordova Baptist Church under the auspices of the Cordova Temperance Reform Association. This association hoped to keep control of the library movement, but it was soon voted to set up the Free Library and Reading room with a voluntary group to support and manage it. This group pledged to pay 25 cents quarterly to support the library. Community supporters, stands at the July 4th celebrations and extra donations were all tried, but it was soon clear that more money was needed.

The trustees decided to reorganize under state regulations and have a Township Library and Reading Room. A petition was circulated at the April 1878 elections, the voters favored a one mill tax on township property.

The first order of books included encyclopedias, histories, complete works of Byron, Shakespeare, Dickens, Pinkertons and Homer, also a Horse Owners Cyclopedia, A Transmission of Life, A Physical Life of a Woman, 20,000 Leagues under the Sea and Ten Nights in the Bar Room.

Join us in reading this heartfelt historical novel inspired by the true 1938 cross-country trek of two giraffes destined for the San Diego Zoo. Told through the memories of Woodrow Wilson Nickel, now 105, the story follows his youthful adventure driving the giraffes from New York to California amid the lingering hardships of the Great Depression and the Dust Bowl. Along the way he forms deep bonds—with the graceful animals, a rugged zookeeper, and a spirited photographer—while encountering the kindness of strangers and confronting personal and social challenges. Rich in historical detail, the novel blends adventure, coming-of-age growth, and reflections on hope, resilience, and the transformative power of the natural world.

In 1922, Count Alexander Rostov is deemed an unrepentant aristocrat by a Bolshevik tribunal, and is sentenced to house arrest in the Metropol, a grand hotel across the street from the Kremlin. Rostov, an indomitable man of erudition and wit, has never worked a day in his life, and must now live in an attic room while some of the most tumultuous decades in Russian history are unfolding outside the hotel's doors.

Unexpectedly, his reduced circumstances provide him entry into a much larger world of emotional discovery.
